

6. INFRASTRUCTURE:

The college has eighteen well-ventilated rooms, eight well equipped laboratories with central generator facility. Three labs have UPS facility. Most departments are provided with LCD and Overhead projectors. A seminar hall with audio-visual facility and a laboratory with a UV spectrometer are available for Researchers in Chemistry. Zoology lab is equipped with Interactive Board. Rest room for girl students and lady staff members have been provided a cricket ground, table tennis boards, volleyball court, shuttle badminton court are available. A multi-specialty gymnasium facility has been established with UGC assistance. Our institution has an auditorium with a seating capacity of nearly 700 seats for the use of all colleges run by our management.

Separate rooms are provided for Career Guidance Cell, First Aid Centre, NCC and NSS. Canteen, drinkingwater facility and Parking is available for staff and students. The campus has two motorized bore wells apart from corporation water facility is provided.
