IQAC

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has been established with the intention of ensuring and monitoring quality across all facets of our college. With a steadfast commitment to enhancing performance, IQAC has implemented several mechanisms aimed at upholding excellence.

At the outset of each academic year, IQAC collaborates closely with every department and committee to formulate an annual calendar of events. This meticulously crafted calendar serves as a guiding beacon, delineating qualitative benchmarks for departments and various college committees to adhere to throughout the academic journey. It not only outlines timelines for assessments but also allocates slots for diverse cultural and sports activities, fostering holistic development among students.

Furthermore, IQAC maintains vigilant oversight to ensure the seamless execution of scheduled events within stipulated timelines. Regular meetings convened by IQAC serve as dynamic forums for strategizing on quality enhancement measures, fostering a culture of continuous improvement within our institution.

IQAC has contributed significantly for the quality assurance by setting up various mechanisms related to academic, non-academic and administrative activities. We shall describe few of the existing mechanisms for the quality assurance:

1. Related to Teaching-Learning:

- A structured student mentoring system, initiated by IQAC, assigns no more than 30 students to each teacher for personalized mentoring.
 - Each mentor maintains a diary containing student information and records of counseling sessions.
- IQAC supports departments in conducting coaching sessions for PG entrance exams, certificate courses, and competitive examinations.
- At the end of each semester, departments analyze results and reflect upon them.
- IQAC conducts an annual analysis of overall results, framing necessary strategies based on reflections in IQAC meetings.

2. Feedback:

- Feedback from stakeholders:
 - ➢ IQAC has implemented a structured feedback collection process involving stakeholders like Students, Parents, Teachers, and Alumni.
 - Analysis of feedback leads to necessary actions being taken to address concerns and enhance quality.

• Academic Audit:

- Each year, the Academic Audit Committee, under IQAC, conducts an academic audit.
- Departments conduct SWOC analysis and reflect on their performance during this audit.
- The committee offers impressions on departmental performance and provides recommendations for improvement.

3. Related to Professional Development of Staff

- **Financial Assistance to Staff:** To encourage teachers to participate in professional development programs, IQAC has devised the mechanism of assisting teachers financially. A policy for the same has also been designed by IQAC.
- Human Resource Development Cell (HRDC): A HRDC has been established in the college with the intention of supporting the professional development of the staff.

4. Support to Sports & Curricular activities for the holistic development

• IQAC has initiated organization of intercollegiate and University level sports and cultural competitions. IQAC also encourages the sports and cultural committees to organize more such events and also to motivate the interested students to participate in such events.

5. Collaborative initiatives

• IQAC has given importance to collaboration with various organizations/institutions for academic and non-academic activities. This would be carried out as per the MoU made where ever possible or through informal understanding between the institutions. Several events have been conducted through collaboration in 2022-23.

6. Other Quality Audits

- As the institution promotes sustainable environmental development, in order to assess ourselves, every year, through IQAC, college undergoes Energy Audit and Green Audit.
- **7. Strengthening the alumni association:** IQAC strives by designing various mechanisms to involve the alumni for the development of the college. In 2023, the alumni association got registered and an alumni meet was conducted in November 2022. By the constant efforts of pursuing our alumni, many alumni have donated amount and instruments to the college in 2022-23.
